<u>PaintUp</u> aims to reinforce the tutor's role in work-based learning, namely in the apprenticeship systems with the involvement of the sector stakeholders and a strong engagement from the companies.

The objective is to bring out, through a mapping of the tutor's role in different VET contexts, the common elements that could make a contribution to a painting, decorating and finishing sector approach, motivating VET providers, schools, companies and teachers, trainers and tutors to improve their skills, namely transversal skills, through a unit learning outcome qualification specifically addressed to the tutors. The tutor plays a crucial role in improving the employability of the trainees and apprentices. The quality of the tutor's training can increase the attractiveness of the sector for the young people boosting skills and employability.

The 7-members partnership is balanced between partners with a strong experience in European projects and new-coming partners. Gathering different traditions on the tutor's role, PaintUp aims to bring together different perspectives and to establish a framework for tutors to support the painter companies in UNIEP's and other countries (the transnationality of the project).

The 7 partners come from 6 countries: Luxembourg, France, UK, Belgium, Slovakia and Portugal:

- 1 European association representing 60.000 Painting companies in 14 countries (Luxembourg);
- 4 Territorial organisms of Professional training (France, UK, Belgium and Slovakia);
- 1 Association managing a platform dedicated to the Painting sector (Belgium);
- 1 Company bringing together a network of international and national experts in vocational education and training (Portugal).

These partners will act with a systematic approach, based on the territorial cooperation among the different actors working in the field of professional training and apprenticeship.

Through a mapping of the tutor's function in painting SMEs, *PaintUp*'s activities will result in:

- a) a tutor's practical activities guide,
- b) a learning tool for company's tutors in Learning Outcomes, and
- c) the designing of an on-line course tailored to tutors.

The project will run for 2 years, starting on 2_{nd} October 2017. It initially foresees the identification of needs, and thereafter the implementation, the experimentation and the evaluation of results.

It will be coordinated by a steering committee composed by members of each partner who will control and guarantee the good implementation of the strategic and functional objectives.

Partners accepted to work together on the new solutions, reinforcing at the same time their performances. Their activities within the project will be complementary, taking into account their own experience and expertise. Each partner will participate to all phases of the project and to the communication, spreading and valorisation of the results.

3 transnational meetings, one on 9th October 2017 (Paris), one on 19th September 2018 (Liège) and the last on 6th June 2019 (Luxembourg) will serve to decide on the procedural and content level of the project's implementation, to correct any deflection, to discuss the products achieved and finally to evaluate the results.









One transnational workshop on 18_{th} September 2018 (Belgium) and a Final Conference on 7_{th} June 2019 (Luxembourg) will represent the opportunity to collect the sector stakeholder's perspectives and then to disseminate the results, while <u>four National Validation Workshops</u> – March/April 2019 in Belgium, France, Slovakia and UK – will give the possibility to the sector's stakeholders to validate the Intellectual Outputs (IO), particularly the Learning tool for Company tutors in Learning Outcomes.

In each country, Paint Tutors Up and its results will:

- create/reinforce the cooperation among Painting/Decorating sector's stakeholders (Professional associations, VET Institutes, Tutors and Contractors);
- support the Building painting sector's tutors in their tasks;
- strengthen the transversal skills required by SMEs in the sector;
- help in recognizing the units of learning outcomes of the new qualification: Painting Tutor;
- improve training provision adapted to labour market needs.

The partners will be able, in a longer term period, to use the results of Paint Tutors Up project. In fact the free on-line course available on the brand-new project website and on the one of each partner will assure an adequate and updated training of tutors in the painting sector.







Paint Tutors Up 2017-2019

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1. Partners and their contribution to the project

The project gathers main stakeholders in the Construction Painting sector representing thousands of SMEs as well as recognised Institutes and Experts in Vocational Training and Apprenticeship:

- 1 European association representing 60.000 Painting companies in 14 countries, **UNIEP** (Luxembourg), leader of the project, which is the unique voice for painting contractors and allied trades, being the authoritative trade association representing Professional Painters.
- 4 Territorial Organisms of Professional training (France, UK, Belgium and Slovakia): **CCCA-BTP** (FR) which is a professional organization in charge of coordinating the apprenticeship in the construction industry. **IFAPME** (BE) which is a training centre with around 15.000 students and more than 1.000 certified people per year. **SIOV** (SK) which is a professional and educational institution of the Ministry of Education, guarantor for the issues of vocational education and training for the whole network of secondary VET schools. **Doncaster College** (UK) which is a VET provider with strong competences in the painting sector and apprenticeship programmes.
- 1 Association managing a platform dedicated to the Painting sector (Belgium): **EPP** (BE) which is a brand-new association that seeks to share the experiences/projects of UNIEP, UNIEP-related educational institutes and manufacturers through a platform dedicated to the Painting sector (VET, students and apprentices, tutors and trainers, companies and producer).
- 1 Company bringing together a network of international and national experts in vocational education and training (Portugal): **IMANOVATION** (PT) which is a private sector company with a strong experience in apprenticeship and quality assurance.

These organisations with complementary backgrounds will work together to build useful and sustainable products and to ensure the achievement and impact assessment of the project's goals. Each partner, even if it will participate to all activities foreseen (see section 2), will have the following specific responsibilities:

- UNIEP, being the coordinator of the project, will be responsible for the whole management of the project preparing the tools and templates for each step of the project management to be used for all partners, including a budget plan for each of them and the instructions on how partners should report costs and administrative issues to the applicant. Communication among the partners as well as the dissemination plan will be under UNIEP's responsibility.
- CCCA-BTP will be responsible for mapping the tutorial function in the Painting SMEs from the partner countries.
- IFAPME will be in charge of designing the Units of Learning outcomes for the tutorial qualification.
- SIOV will perform as an umbrella organisation by carrying out a Multiplier event in order to
 ensure the validation of the learning tool for company's tutors by the sector stakeholders.
- Doncaster College will support the tutors with guidelines and recommendations addressed to the tutors.
- EPP as technological partner will be responsible for the digitalisation of the course which will in turn provide a recognised certificate to the tutors.
- IMANOVATION will guarantee the quality and will monitor the project, its partnerships and products.
